A NOTE FROM THE WRITER

Welcome to DIXON ROAD!

Since I was a kid I've loved musicals. The magic of breaking into song, the heart, the DRAMA! I loved every bit of it. Now after years of development, today you get to experience all that musicals have to offer but this time told through a Somali family navigating their dreams in a new country. **DIXON ROAD** has been such a gift to me. When I told my father that I was going to quit trying to be a doctor and embrace being a storyteller I feared that it would create a divide between us. But in writing this show, where part of my job was to get to listen to all of his stories, I found that walking in my purpose was what brought us closer together.

I am so excited for a new era when Somali folks regain control of our own narrative. My hope is that it in a few years **DIXON ROAD** isn't the only musical about a Black Muslim family. I can't wait until each of us gets a chance to follow our dreams.

"Adduunyo waa hooska labadiisa gelin" is a Somali proverb that translates to "The world is like a shadow: in the morning it is turned towards one direction, in the evening towards the opposite one." **DIXON ROAD** is a musical, in many ways similar to the ones that I loved growing up, but it is certainly a change in direction for what musicals can be.






