Chair's Report



This season marked a number of important milestones for Canadian Stage. From renewed box office success, to organizational stability, to financial security, this year has set Canadian Stage up for the future. Centred around the art, the team has worked hard to grow the company while reinforcing a stable base on which it can flourish.

With his first full season of programming behind him, Artistic Director Brendan Healy set out to program an ambitious and compelling season. From the outset, with the darkly comic fable of brotherly love in *Topdog/Underdog*, through to the epic retelling of E.M. Forster's *Howards End* in *The Inheritance*, and finally with the soft exploration of the relationship between our bodies, food, and the land in *NOMADA*, this season has provided something for everyone.

If guiding all of this wasn't enough, Brendan undertook the grueling job of directing *The Inheritance!*

While audiences were mesmerized, challenged, soothed, and entertained, our Executive Director, Monica Esteves, worked tirelessly to position the company for long-term success. Her efforts, along with the company's development team, have successfully eliminated the deficit that has hung over the company's head since the merger 40-something years ago. In addition to financial security, the team has finalized the strategic plan that will allow us to continue driving the company forward with forethought and direction.

One of the highlights of the season was our annual gala. Held in May at The Globe and Mail Centre, this year we expanded the number of awards to include worthy recipients in the artistic and philanthropic worlds, in addition to the development sector. We had the pleasure of celebrating Philip Akin's contribution to the arts with the Artistic Achievement Prize, the Sabourins for their seemingly limitless support of the arts with the Cultural Champion Award, and Alfredo Romano with this year's City Builders Award. It was an entertaining night filled with love for the arts and for Canadian Stage.

On behalf of the board, I want to extend my gratitude to our family of supporters—from government, to donors, to audiences and various partners. Your support has enabled us to achieve so much this year.

I am lucky to have served alongside so many directors who took the time to dedicate themselves to achieving success this year. In particular, I am grateful for the many directors who participated in the various committees and company work that goes above and beyond the board's duties. I would like to extend a special thanks to the outgoing directors, Vanessa Pfaff and Drew Sinclair, both of whom brought their professional expertise to the company and helped guide it through important actions for the future.

The 23.24 season was a year of meaningful progress and artistic growth for Canadian Stage, made possible through the dedication of our team and the unwavering support of our community. In the pages ahead, we're proud to share the achievements that we've all helped bring to life together.

We launched the year celebrating forty years of Dream in High Park with *A Midsummer Night's Dream*, the first Shakespeare ever to be performed on the hill. Our season at the Bluma featured two internationally acclaimed dance artists and longstanding friends of Canadian Stage: Akram Khan with his inventive adaptation, *Jungle Book reimagined*, and Crystal Pite with *Assembly Hall*.

We produced the Canadian premieres of two major international plays: *The Lehman Trilogy* and *The Inheritance*. Both productions affirmed the extraordinary talent we have in Canada and our ability to create productions at a quality that rivals what is found on stages around the world.

At the Berkeley, we kicked off our season with an incisive production of Suzan-Lori Parks' *Topdog/Underdog*. We celebrated five years of Red Sky Performance with a series dedicated to Indigenous dance. We welcomed Australia's Back to Back Theatre with their production of *The Shadow Whose Prey the Hunter Becomes*.

We welcomed Toronto's Quote Unquote Collective with the premiere of a new Canadian musical, *Universal Child Care*. And we rounded off the season with the presentation of the Festival of New Theatre and the Canadian Festival of New Musicals, in partnership with the Musical Stage Company, which showcased ten new works in development.

I am deeply grateful to everyone who made this ambitious season a success. To our artists and partner organizations, our committed board of directors, and our staff and volunteers, I say congratulations. Together, we delivered a year of unforgettable live performance.

And to all of you, our supporters, I offer a heartfelt thank you. Your generosity allowed this company to soar to new heights!

In a time when the live performing arts sector continues to navigate the challenges of post-pandemic audience engagement, Canadian Stage is thriving. Our box office revenues nearly doubled compared to the prior season, a testament to the enduring appetite for live theatre. These results are deeply validating as we work to spark connections between many thousands of Canadian audiences and artists each year.

From Akram Khan's breathtaking Jungle Book reimagined to Crystal Pite's powerful Assembly Hall, and the epic two-part drama The Inheritance by Matthew Lopez, masterfully directed by Brendan Healy, our programming aimed high. The ambition of these large-scale stories was supported by the generosity of the Slaight Family Foundation at a time when many might feel compelled to scale down, reminding us that in challenging times, audiences need to experience the transformative power of theatre in unforgettable ways.

We also completed the first year of a three-year plan to rebuild our education and community outreach programs, thanks to the Marilyn & Charles Baillie Family Foundation. From welcoming students into our spaces to establishing partnerships with schools and communities, we are laying the groundwork for a bright future.

In a major financial milestone, we eliminated Canadian Stage's longstanding deficit, a challenge that had persisted since the organization's founding in 1987. This was achieved through the generous leadership of Paul and Janice Sabourin and the Sabourin Family Foundation, in honour of our former Board Chair Alexandra Baillie, along with the support of past and current board members and donors. For the first time in nearly four decades, Canadian Stage moves forward with a clean financial slate.

None of this would have been possible without the incredible talents of our artists, staff, board members, volunteers, and supporters—and, of course, our audiences. Thank you for sharing in the transformative power of live theatre.

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


Engaging new audiences and breaking ticket sale milestones

- Witnessed the highest single-ticket sales since 2008, highlighting the growing demand for ambitious and compelling theatre







In 23.24, Canadian Stage launched the Festival of New Theatre (FONT), a cornerstone of our long-term strategy to foster the creation of innovative new work in-house.

Supported by the Fabio Mascarin Foundation, FONT provides a vital platform for boundary-pushing theatrical creations, blending largescale presentations with workshops, staged readings, and opportunities for public feedback early in a work's development. This festival also serves as a hub for collaboration and connection, bringing together artists, audiences, and industry leaders to exchange ideas, support creative risks, and shape the future of Canadian theatre. FONT underscores our commitment to nurturing bold storytelling and ensuring a vibrant cultural landscape for years to come.

Canadian Stage was formed through the merger of CentreStage and Toronto Free Theatre in 1987, carrying forward a deficit that has persisted since its inception. Over the decades, numerous board and leadership teams have made considerable efforts to address this longstanding financial challenge.

Today, Canadian Stage celebrates a historic milestone: the elimination of its accumulated debt, held since its incorporation in 1987. This extraordinary achievement was made possible through The Alexandra Baillie Legacy Fund, the debt elimination campaign initiated by Paul and Janice Sabourin, whose leadership inspired generous contributions from board members and supporters.

Steered by current board members Hugh Clark and Sara Angel, alongside past board chairs Susan Crocker, Ron LaLonde, and Maureen Parkinson, the campaign generated significant enthusiasm and widespread support. In early 2025, contributors and supporters will gather to unveil a commemorative plaque honouring Alexandra, as part of the celebration of this transformative moment in Canadian Stage's history.

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We were inspired by Canadian Stage's resilience and incredible work, on and off the stage. It became clear that the debt on the balance sheet did not reflect the healthy, vibrant organization it has become. In honour of past Board Chair Alexandra Baillie's leadership through some of the toughest years, we saw this as an opportunity to rally support and erase this debt for good.

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Theatre Ball 2024

Canadian Stage's annual fundraising gala, Theatre Ball, was an unqualified success for the company. Held on May 28 at the stunning Globe and Mail Centre. 275 guests gathered for an evening of celebration, inspiration, and a touch of competitive bidding.

The event raised over \$400,000 in support of the company's many artistic and community initiatives. A particular highlight was the live auction, led by the ever-charismatic auctioneer Stephen Ranger, which brought in over \$80,000 for Canadian Stage's access programs. These programs ensure that more than 15,000 free or deeply discounted theatre tickets are available to the public each year.

Among the most coveted auction prizes? A \$10,000 walk-on cameo role at the Winter Garden Theatre. Not to be outdone, Estée Lauder Companies Canada—one of the evening's corporate in-kind sponsors—sweetened the pot by offering gift baskets for \$5,000 donors. In all, over 40 guests enthusiastically contributed to the live auction in support of our access programs

The evening also welcomed an esteemed guest: Mayor Olivia Chow, who gave a heartfelt speech praising Canadian Stage and reaffirming her steadfast support for the arts in Toronto. The event's host, the fabulous dancer, choreographer, and actor Hollywood Jade, kept the energy high throughout the night. Guests were treated to a range of dazzling performances by artists from the Canadian Stage family, including a soulful musical performance by Ben Page (*The Inheritance*); a gripping monologue from *Hamlet* by Maev Beaty (star of *My Name is Lucy Barton* in our 24.25 season); and a jazz-filled, show-stopping number from Janelle Cooper (*Fall on Your Knees*).

All in all, it was a spectacular evening—a perfect blend of generosity, talent, and theatre magic, proving once again that Canadian Stage's mission continues to be deeply embraced by the community.
